DESHAM PALLIATIVE CARE

Desham Palliative Care was born some eighteen months ago when Jairaj Ramachandran, an IIT Madras alumnus residing in the USA, wanted to give back to his ancestral roots. He teamed up with Gopukrishna Pillai, a doctor passionate about making a difference for the underserved in rural Kerala, creating Desham PC. It is located in the town of Nemmara, and serves several adjoining Panchayats. It is currently staffed by one full time facilitator, and a part time doctor, nurse and physiotherapist.



Desham PC relies on Pallium India for its expertise, but is independently funded by the generosity of one corporate donor (CGH Earth), and several donors from the 1977 graduating class of IIT Madras. Thanks to a recent sizable donation, Desham PC was able to acquire it's own vehicle. It is a huge boost for the fledgling center, as it continues to reach remote areas with home care.
