



GOOD. TO. GO - DEATH LITERACY FESTIVAL

Bengaluru, India recently hosted India's first Good-To-Go Death Literacy Festival, organized by Pallium India and the Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy, with support from the Microland Foundation, Together for a Better Tomorrow, and the Ajit Isaac Foundation. The two-day event on 23rd and 24th of August 2025, at the Bangalore International Centre, Domlur, sought to normalise conversations about death, dying, advance care planning, bereavement, and grief. Doctors reminded us that most people experience a gradual decline and that having honest discussions and preparing Advance Medical Directives are crucial for dignity at the end of life. Caregivers shared moving stories on the value of openness—"If you think the conversation is difficult now, it'll be impossible later," said actor and caregiver Darius Sunawala—while experts urged that palliative care be recognised as a public health right, extending beyond hospitals to homes. The festival showed that talking about death is not morbid—it is an act of love, preparedness, and humanity.

THATTUKADA AT KAW SUMMER FEST


